DEFINITIONS/USAGE TIPS**Antiphon**

Said before and after each psalm. Used during Matins, Laud and Vespers. Pause at the asterisk when intoning (a la caesura). On Doubles: said in full before and after the psalm. On Semi-doubles and Simples: recite up to the † before the psalm, recite in full after the psalm.

‡ The Lord be with you. R And with thy spirit.

Laypersons (non-ordained) should substitute the following, using *my* or *our* as appropriate:

‡ O Lord, hear *my* prayer.

R And let *my* cry come unto thee.
